**Details of the applicant** 

Chief Assistant. Professor Aneta Petrova Atanasova is an excellent scientist and lecturer

at the Department of General, Experimental, Developmental and Health Psychology, Faculty

of Philosophy, Sofia University "St. Kl. Ohridski". She has held the positions of Assistant

Professor, Senior Assistant Professor and Chief Assistant Professor in the same department.

She also impresses with her active and various activities as a lecturer, researcher, consultant,

trainer, expert, supervisor and expert in scientific projects, etc. She is a respected scholar and highly qualified teacher in the field of competition.

## **Description of scientific works**

The candidate participated in the procedure with the following 20 publications: one monograph, one published book based on a defended dissertation for the award of PhD, one article published in a journal refereed and indexed in world-known databases and 10 articles published in non-refereed peer-reviewed journals, 5 studies published in non-refereed peer-reviewed journals or published in edited collective volumes and 2 chapters published as part of a collective monograph.

## **Scientific contributions**

The scientific production proposed by the candidate is characterized by an extremely thorough and wide-ranging knowledge of the matter under study. The main work related to the procedure is the presented monograph by Aneta Petrova Atanasova from 2018 "Diagnosis and Assessment of Autism Spectrum Disorders" by University Press "St. Kliment Ohridski", with a volume of 469 pages. The monograph is the result of many years of research activity as well as the author's psychological practice with children and young people with autism spectrum disorder. The bibliographic reference includes 293 sources in Bulgarian, English and Russian. Autism spectrum disorder is examined through the major explanatory concepts and the areas of functioning: social behaviour and communication, intellectual and cognitive functioning, behaviour, independence and autonomy. The description of assessment methods and tools is of immense help to professionals in the field. The scientific information contained in the monograph is interpreted and integrated on the basis of a wide range of theoretical, diagnostic, methodological, therapeutic and purely practical aspects. This work is a systematic review of current and classic concepts, empirical research, diagnostic tools and psychotherapeutic practices. A serious contribution from an applied aspect is the inclusion of cases from the author's practical experience. The book has received numerous positive reviews from practitioners in the field, and further printings of the monograph by University Press are evidence of this.

Aneta Petrova Atanasova addresses the topic of the autism spectrum in a number of other scientific articles. The focus of her research and publishing activity (independently and in co-authorship) is: psychodiagnostics and assessment methods, psychological aspects of

inclusive education, dyslexia and other specific disorders at primary school age, postpartum

depression, children's mental health, breastfeeding and child development, etc.

The applicant has reported 16 citations. Two of them are in journals indexed in world-

renowned databases, three are in collective volumes, and 11 citations are found in non-refereed

peer-reviewed journals.

She is the director of one research project and participates as an expert in another one.

**Teaching work** 

The candidate has extensive teaching experience. She teaches at St. Kl. Ohridski" since

2000, which means that she has accumulated solid experience. Aneta Petrova Atanasova

teaches courses at BA and MA levels. Over the years, she has supervised many successfully

defended thesis from Bachelor and Master programs. Undoubtedly, the candidate's long and

varied teaching experience is well suited to the specifics of the current competition, as well as

to her research specialty.

Conclusion

After acquaintance with the submitted materials and scientific works of the candidate,

as well as after analysis of their significance and contributions, I confidently give my positive

assessment and recommend the Scientific Jury to elect Chief Assistant Professor Aneta Petrova
