How to apply	If you want to study as an exchange student at the Business School of Bern University of Applied Sciences, there must be an exchange agreement between Bern University of Applied Sciences and your home university (*). Then the following process applies: • Get nominated by your Erasmus Coordinator at your home university (your Erasmus Coordinator sends an official nomination to international.business@bfh.ch.) • The BFH Business School International Office will contact the nominated students and send a link to complete and submit the application online. • The International Office will process the applications. • Accepted students will receive the Letter of Acceptance and further information about their Exchange Semester in Bern. 	Confirmation of English language skills (min. B2 level)	
Requirements	Level of Study: students should have collected at least 60 ECTS credits or the equivalent thereof within a Bachelor in Business Administration or similar degree programme at their home university. Language requirements: students, who wish to attend modules offered in German, but who are not native speakers of German, should have German language proficiency equivalent to C1 of the Common European Framework. For modules conducted in English, a B2 proficiency in English is required.

Application Process	Your home university is responsible for the application process and the selection of students. Students must apply directly at their home university.

How to apply	The online registration for the Bachelor programme is available here: www.bfh.ch/en/studies/anmeldung.html	
Requirements	 Applicants with the qualifications listed below are eligible for direct admission to the degree programmes. Students with an international educational background must: provide a university entrance qualification (or an equivalent qualification awarded by an institute of higher education abroad) at least one year's work experience in a business/commercial environment (full-time employment) meet the criteria as per Swiss Universities Regulations for each respective country:	
Language Skills	BSc Business Administration International Programme modules are taught in English. We expect an English level of at least B2, however a level of C1 is recommended. Since most of the Business Information Systems modules are conducted in German, you will need to be competent in German at an advanced level (C1). Applicants should also have a good command of English (i.e. C1 level or CAE or 6.5 - 7.0 IELTS score) as much of the literature on the subject is in English and some of the courses are held in English.	
Application Deadline	The regular deadline is 31 March every year. Although we will accept applications after this date, we may not be able to guarantee a place on the course for applicants who submit late applications.	



Student Life	
International Family Mentor	At the Business School of Bern University of Applied Sciences we have an "International Family" arrangement, where each exchange and international degree student will be assigned to an international family. Each international family has two mentors, who will help in getting through the first few weeks in the new surroundings. "Mentors" are BFH students, who volunteer to help one or more of our international students.
Welcome Week	This event is a great opportunity to meet your fellow international students and the International Office team. It will provide you with useful background information about Switzerland in general and Bern and BFH specifically. The Welcome Week is a mandatory week for all Incoming Exchange and International Programme Regular Students and will take place in:

Entry & Stay in Switzerland	
Visa Requirements	To enter the country, foreign nationals need a valid travel document, which is recognised by Switzerland. In some cases, a visa is also required. In addition, Exchange Students must submit a residence application, financial proof and take out health insurance on their own behalf. For further information check the International Relations website: www.bfh.ch/en/service/international_relations_office/incoming_st udents
Accommodation	BFH does not have onsite accommodation facilities. Students are responsible for their own housing needs. However, the International Office is pleased to support the students in finding accommodation. We recommend staying in the student lodging, where the BFH holds a small allotment for International Students (first come first serve). Prices range from between CHF 500 and CHF 1000 per month, depending on facilities. You find information about accommodation on the homepage of the Bern Student Lodging: www.vbsl.ch. Vacant rooms and apartments are also advertised on the Internet: www.housinganywhere.com
Health Insurance	In Switzerland, contracting a health and accident insurance policy for stays of longer than three months, is mandatory. A basic insurance plan covers medical care in the case of sickness or accident.
	After arriving in Switzerland and registering with your municipality of residence, you have three months in which to take out health insurance. Provided you register within this time, you are insured from the time you enter Switzerland. Students are responsible for taking out health insurance themselves.
Living Expenses	Students should calculate approx. CHF 1'500 per month.
Financial Proof	For Non-Erasmus Students: To obtain a residence permit, students must be able to prove, as required, to have sufficient financial means for the stay (at least CHF 1500 per month). This proof can be in the form of any of the following: a bank statement, confirmation from the person who is financially supporting you and/or a grant certificate.



Your Arrival

The city of Bern has an excellent public transport system, which Transport System extends to neighboring suburbs and towns. A special ticket is available for approx. CHF 55 per month for students under 25 years of age. It offers unlimited bus, tram and train travel to commute to the University and explore the city and its surroundings. For further details go to Bern Mobil. www.bernmobil.com Bern's ideal central position makes it a perfect point of departure for excursions throughout Switzerland. The Swiss Federal Railways offers a railcard (Halbtax-Abo) which costs approx CHF 150 per year. Holders of the Halbtax-Abo pay only half fare for trips by train, post bus, and boat. In addition a range of special tickets (Gleis 7) and services for young people are available. www.sbb.ch
